



On September 22, 2016, thousands of fathers, foster fathers, grandfathers, uncles, brothers, godfathers, cousins, and other significant male caregivers will walk or drive their children to school to show their support of their children's education.

HOW IT WORKS:

Employers are asked to allow fathers and other male caregivers to arrange their schedule in order to accompany their children to school and help get the school year started right.

Men and their children should arrive 15-30 minutes before the starting bell.

Fathers and other men should be welcomed guests at their children's school, given a lapel sticker to show they participated, and asked to complete a participation card.

Some schools will have information and activities available. Fathers and other men will only go into schools if school staff invites them in. Otherwise, they will leave after their children enter the building.

The Fame Fathers Walk is coordinated by Fame Fathers and is supported by the Summit County Fatherhood Initiative; Stark County Fatherhood Coalition; Akron Public Schools and public/private schools throughout northeast Ohio; Summit County Council; the City of Akron; area PTA and PTO Councils; and Akron and Vicinity Interdenominational Ministerial Alliance (AVIMA).

When men are involved in their child's education, their children perform better in school.
